Peabody Community Fund Guidelines 2016-17

About Peabody Community Grants

Peabody wants to ensure that London is a city of opportunity for all. In these tough economic times, they are investing more resources to provide more support to the people and communities they work with.

The London Community Foundation is delighted to again be managing the Peabody Community Grants funding programme in 2016-17. The Community Grants programme awards grants from £500 up to £5,000 to charities, resident and community organisations working for the benefit of people who live in the areas in which Peabody operates. In particular, we want to support Peabody residents.

Roles of The London Community Foundation and Peabody

The London Community Foundation (LCF) is an independent charity focused on social action. We achieve this primarily through our grantmaking. Our aim is to make it easier for communities to bring about positive social change. Unlike other Trusts and Foundations we do not just give out our 'own' money, rather we work with a range of donors, supporting predominantly small charities and community groups to tackle local issues



Funding Decision



Please note that organisations cannot apply for more than one grant within a 12 month period.

Fund Criteria

Grants of between £500 and £5,000 are available for activities which improve the quality of life of Peabody residents by supporting local activities that:

- Are responding to identified community need
- Bring communities together
- Promote wellbeing

The Fund is able to support activities benefitting residents of all ages and **priority will be given to:**

- Organisations/projects addressing the needs of the most disadvantaged members of the community
- **Peabody resident-led projects.** If an applicant organisation is not resident-led, they will need to demonstrate strong connections with local residents, strong partnership working in the locality, a commitment to the locality after the proposed project is complete, and a clear understanding of community needs
- In 2016/17 up to 50% of the funding will be available for projects located in the following boroughs: **Haringey, Hillingdon, Redbridge and Wandsworth**
- Youth led projects up to the age of 24.

Activities must demonstrate the beneficiaries will be Peabody residents.

Examples of projects that might be funded include; however this list is not exhaustive:

- Literacy and numeracy projects for children and young people
- After-school clubs provision
- Employment and training opportunities

- Advice and support for those who are vulnerable or marginalised
- Projects that promote community cohesion
- Activities that promote health and well-being for older people, i.e. exercise classes or befriending services
- Food banks, or projects that help to reduce poverty
- Projects which promote involvement in the local community, i.e. volunteering

Who Can Apply?

The following organisations are eligible to apply:

- Constituted community and resident groups
- Registered charities
- Companies limited by guarantee
- Social enterprises
- Community Interest Companies (CICs)
- Charitable Incorporated Organisations (CIOs)

Projects with no clear plan for how to benefit Peabody residents cannot be funded. If you are unsure whether your organisation is operating in a Peabody area please contact the Peabody Community Investment Team to discuss your project before applying (contact details below).

Applicants must:

- be supporting Peabody residents. Applicants will be expected to have researched Peabody stock in the area (available via LCF and Peabody) and demonstrate that they have a clear strategy for engaging Peabody residents in their project
- demonstrate that the proposal is in response to identified community need
- have a minimum of 3 unrelated Management Committee members
- have a governing document, i.e. a constitution or Memorandum & Articles
- have a bank account in the name of the group, with at least 2 unrelated signatories – or provide details of another group who will be managing any grant awarded, with a copy of the partnership arrangement
- have a record of income and expenditure or annual accounts (if a group is new with no previous income they will need to provide a recent bank statement)
- Have an annual income of less than £100,000. However, organisations with an annual income of under £500,000 are eligible to apply if they have a proven track record of working with Peabody residents
- have a “safeguarding policy” if working with young people under the age of 18, or if you are working with vulnerable adults (groups can contact us if they need help with this and we can also provide them with our guide on safeguarding policies). Groups will also need to have DBS checks where required
- have the relevant insurance in place, including public liability where required, before delivering activities.

Grant Size

Grants of between £500 and £5,000 are available covering any costs relating to your proposed project. A maximum of £5,000 is available to any group within a financial year period (i.e. April-March).

What/who cannot be funded through this programme?

- Local Authorities
 - any party political activity
 - purely commercial ventures (for profit)
 - spending that has already taken place (i.e. retrospective funding)
 - individual sponsorship
 - activities promoting religious beliefs
 - activities where people are excluded on religious grounds
 - activities where people are excluded on the basis of religion, sexual orientation, gender (unless the issue being dealt with is gender-specific), ethnicity.
 - organisations with overdue or incomplete monitoring on a previous grant from The London Community Foundation and/or Peabody
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Monitoring and Evaluation

Groups in receipt of a grant will be required to complete a short form outlining how the grant was spent and highlighting the benefits for residents. You will be provided with the link to the online form when your project is close to finishing.

Monitoring and evaluating the projects funded by our grants enables your group and us to better understand the impact of the grant. It helps us to more fully understand community needs, enables your group and us to learn from your project and can also help you put together information that can help to inform future plans.

It is also recommended that organisations should collect valuable information on how people benefit from your work, what works and what doesn't, how you can make your services more effective, and also demonstrate to future funders the value of your work. Closing Dates for Applications

Please return your application form and all supporting documents by the deadlines listed below, no later than 12noon.

Friday 24th March 2017

When you will hear the outcome:

End of September 2016

End of May 2017

What happens next?

Applications which best fit the Community Grants programme themes and priority areas will be shortlisted. Shortlisted applicants will then be contacted by a Programme Manager from The London Community Foundation for an informal chat to find out more about your project.

Shortlisted applications will be presented to the Peabody Panel. Successful and unsuccessful applicants will be notified of the decision in writing.

Timetable for spending the grant

Successful applicants will have up to 12 months from the offer date to spend any grant awarded, and a further 6 weeks after this date to submit monitoring. Grants cannot cover activities taking place before any grant is awarded.

HOW TO APPLY

Please note this is an online application form.

In exceptional circumstances where you have no access to the internet you may contact us and outline why you cannot access the internet and if reasonable we will send you a paper application form. Please contact applications@londoncf.org.uk or call the office and ask to speak with the programme manager.

Please read the instructions carefully, tick to say you agree and have understood, enter your e-mail address and click on the “Send e-mail and continue”

Once you have done this you will be sent an e-mail with a link to your unique online application form. You should receive the email within a couple of minutes (please check your spam folder). If you do not receive an email it may be that you have not entered your email correctly – please be careful and check the address before submitting.

The supporting documents you will need to provide are:

- Your governing document (e.g. your constitution or memorandum and articles)
- Annual accounts OR bank statement if you are a new group
- Equal Opportunities Policy
- Safeguarding policies if working with young people under 18 or vulnerable adults

If you are emailing your documents, please clearly state your organisation’s name in the subject line along with the fund name.

Where possible, please try to send all your attachments in one email by zipping your documents. However, if you need to send more than one email, please number them as follows:

e.g. *Joe Blogs Foundation, Peabody Community Fund, Email 1 of 2*

Please note if your email is too large it will not be accepted by our email system – try to keep all of your emails to below 2MB.

If you have received funding from The London Community Foundation within the last two years, you need only submit your accounts and health and safety policy.

Please contact us if you would like help or are unable to complete an application online.

Deadline for Applications

Please return your form and all supporting documents by email or by post, by **12noon on Friday 22nd July 2016** or **12noon on Friday 24th March 2017**.

Please note we are unable to consider applications that are submitted after the deadline or those that do not have the supporting documents included.

Please do not hesitate to contact the programmes team if you would like to discuss your proposal prior to making an application, or if you need help with completing the form or providing the supporting documents.

Some top tips for top applications:

- Draft your responses before completing the online form
- Make sure that every question has been answered in full (the online form will prompt you)
- Ensure your budget section has a clear breakdown of all the costs associated with your project
- Get somebody to read through the application before sending, preferably someone who knows nothing about the project. This is a great way to pick up on any mistakes or lack of information and rectify it before submitting.

What happens next?

We aim to let you know the outcome of your application in around ten weeks of the closing date. Successful applicants will have a maximum period of 12 months to spend the grant, with the monitoring report due within 6 weeks after the project has been completed.
