Angel Shed Theatre Company	Towards funding 1-to-1 access support workers enabling 65 young people with disabilities in Islington to participate in creative inclusion classes in theatre, dance and music over two years.	£39,520
Artbox London	To develop a series of 20 or more accessible online videos co-created with 85 artists with learning disabilities and autism from Islington and across London, showcasing their creativity and sharing "how to" guides to support creative inclusion.	£22,528
Barking & Dagenham Ab Phab Youth Club	To deliver weekly digital inclusion sessions and creative inclusion activities such as dance, mask making, drama performances and Carnival based arts sessions for 50 young people with disabilities aged 11-25 in Barking and Dagenham.	£38,853
Bexley Snap	To fund a two-year co-designed creative inclusion drama project for 60 disabled children and young people aged 11-25 living in Bexley, with workshop including script/song writing, making backdrops/props, and inspirational trips to creative venues. Each cohort will write, practice and perform their own production.	£39,036
Club Soda	To fund the development of the Leisure Link project which provides extensive information about leisure, arts and sport related opportunities in Croydon for people with a learning disability supporting both digital and creative inclusion. Core digital media skills in producing, editing and publishing content will be delivered to 30 participants who will then progress to joining the production of online content, a bi-monthly printed magazine or podcasts.	£35,078
Disability Action Haringey	To fund an inclusive Creative Social Activities Programme which will be co-designed by and open to over 300 disabled and primarily older, non- disabled Haringey residents, with the lead organisation being Disability Action Haringey and their main delivery partner, Haringey Circle.	£40,000

Empowering Deaf Society	To support 200 Deaf people with digital inclusion through access to digital training in small groups, delivered in British Sign Language in Camden and Redbridge, on a range of topics including online banking, text to speech, paying parking or buying shopping online. 10% of the budget is for capacity building which could contribute towards a CRM system.	£39,993
Hackney People First	To fund weekly Digital Inclusion learning sessions for 20 individuals with learning disabilities in Hackney over two years, and to support organisational development to build skills to strengthen the charity's governance and embedding stronger internal digital and internal communications.	£39,997
Hear Us	To run creative inclusion sessions and workshops over 2 years through which 200 people with lived experience of mental ill health in Croydon will produce artwork capturing their stories, which will be used as part of the 'ReachOut' anti-stigma campaign.	£40,000
Intercultural Roots For Public Health	Towards funding a 2-year digital and creative inclusion project facilitating participation in workshops, support groups, and networking events, and showcase the work of 200 disabled artists in Camden, Islington, Hackney, and beyond via online platforms. Core funding is for staff training and developing long-term sustainability plans.	£40,000
Middlesex Association for the Blind	To fund bespoke one-to-one digital inclusion training for each of 20 people with visual impairment in their own homes in Enfield and Haringey, enabling them to access the online world and also be supported to use assistive technology.	£22,000
Toucan Employment	To deliver twice weekly inclusive digital literacy sessions in small groups over 2 years for 80 Lewisham residents with learning difficulties/disabilities and autism.	£34,930

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
