## **Fund guidelines**

#### **About the Fund**

The Greener Futures Fund, which is managed by The London Community Foundation, was created by Grosvenor in 2021. The aim of the fund continues to be enabling community-led climate action.

The fund is part of Grosvenor's wider Greener Futures £1 million+ community investment programme focusing on communities and the climate emergency. Aimed at improving lives in and around the places Grosvenor is active, the programme supports training and jobs in the green economy, enables community-led climate action and supports young people's access to nature.

These guidelines outline the fund criteria and tell you how to apply. The Greener Futures Fund is managed by The London Community Foundation and is open to proposals for work taking place in Westminster. The fund is particularly interested in projects based in Mayfair and Belgravia and will prioritise funding applications delivering work in these areas.

The deadline for applications is midday on Monday 31st March 2025

#### **Fund** criteria

Grants between £5,000 and £20,000 are available to support work enabling communities to take climate action in Westminster. Applicants can request funding for up to 12 months.

Applications must clearly be about local climate action and should meet at least one of the following priorities:

- Have a positive impact on the local environment
- Encourage local people to get involved in grass roots environmental activities
- Raise awareness of climate change and changing behaviours leading to more local environmental action
- Develop and share knowledge about the environment with others locally
- Provide skills, training or job opportunities for local people connected to the climate response
- Improve access to nature and nature-based climate solutions

Applicants may be based anywhere, but the funded work must benefit communities in Westminster, with priority given to those benefitting South Westminster, especially Mayfair and Belgravia. Applicants must demonstrate good local knowledge and / or local partnership and be able to report on the impact of their work.

This fund supports "<u>full cost recovery</u>", this means that you can apply for the direct costs involved in delivering your project and a proportionate share of your organisation's overheads (the cost of rent / utilities / core administration staff etc. for the whole organisation).

#### **Grant size**

Grants are available from £5,000 to £20,000. The panel are keen to fund a range of grant sizes. Where applications are requesting the grants at the higher end of the range it is expected that they will be able to demonstrate greater impact and will reach larger numbers of beneficiaries.

#### Priority will be given to:

- Projects benefitting communities in South Westminster especially Mayfair and Belgravia
- Smaller, grassroots organisations
- Organisations demonstrating a clear understanding of the local community
- Projects with a clear plan to measure their impact
- Projects which are able to accommodate volunteers from Grosvenor

## Examples of the types of projects that might be funded include:

- Food growing or food waste prevention projects
- Reuse / recycling projects
- Greening and / or wildlife habitats
- Skills development projects for local people relating to the climate response including carbon literacy,
  re-use/repair skills, energy advice & retrofitting
- Sustainable transport schemes such as bike loans
- Supporting the community in generating sustainable energy
- Community-led research and awareness projects
- Digital projects to enhance sustainability such as apps or websites to enable behaviour change or increase local awareness of climate action

## Who can apply?

#### The fund is open to:

- Constituted community groups and resident groups
- Registered charities
- Companies limited by guarantee
- Community Interest Companies (CICs) Limited by guarantee
- Charitable Incorporated Organisations (CIOs)

Please see previous section about the potential for holding a central fund for individuals.

### **Applicants must:**

- Support people living within Westminster
- Have a management committee/board of directors/trustees of at least three unrelated people
- Have a signed constitution or other relevant governance document
- Have a bank account under the name of the group with at least two unrelated signatories
- Have Annual Accounts or an Income and Expenditure Sheet for the post recent financial period
- Have a Safeguarding Policy

## **Closing date for applications**

The deadline for completed applications, including all supporting documents is **midday on Monday 31**st **March 2025** 

## What cannot be funded through this programme?

The following types of organisation are not eligible:

- Companies limited by Shares (including CIC limited by shares).
- Statutory organisations, such as local authorities.
- NHS bodies.
- Co-operative Societies
- Commercial organisations

#### The grant funds cannot be used for:

- Activities that promote religious or political views
- Purely commercial ventures (for profit)
- Spending that has already taken place (i.e. retrospective funding)
- Individual sponsorship or redistribution of a grant to individuals or other organisations
- Activities where people are excluded on the basis of religion, sexual orientation, gender or ethnicity (unless the issue is group-specific)
- Mainstream activities and statutory requirements of hospitals and medical centres (including NHS Trusts), universities, colleges and schools (unless out of school activities)
- There must be no personal benefit attached to the grant

## The following are not eligible to apply:

- Organisations that have had two concurrent years of late submissions to Charity Commission/Companies House within the last two completed financial years
- Organisations that have had two years net current liabilities within the two most recent completed financial years
- Organisations where Trustees are paid unless evidence of approval is provided from the Charity Commission and/or this arrangement is referenced in the governing document
- Organisations with overdue or incomplete monitoring on a previous grant from The London Community Foundation and / or Grosvenor

## How to apply

To apply for a grant, click on the following link

You also need to submit all your supporting documents by uploading them at the end of your application form. We regret we are unable to consider incomplete or late applications.

Supporting documents you need to submit are:

- A copy of your **signed** governing document, i.e. Memorandum and Articles of Association or Constitution
- A copy of your most recent signed annual accounts or a current/forecasted income and expenditure sheet for new organisations
- A copy of your safeguarding policy—this must have a date showing that it has been reviewed in the past 12 months.

We regret we are unable to consider incomplete or late applications, so, please ensure you submit everything by the deadline of <u>midday on Monday 31<sup>st</sup> March 2025</u>

## What happens next?

#### What happens after you have applied?

We may contact you to discuss your ideas by phone or email. You should hear the outcome of your application by June 2025. Therefore, your project should not start before June. If you are awarded a grant, you will have 12 months to spend it.

#### Successful applicants


If your application is successful, you will be required to:

- Credit support from Grosvenor's Greener Futures Fund and The London Community Foundation on all materials related to the funded work (logos will be provided);
- Complete your spending within 12 months. Projects may be shorter than this time but may not exceed it
- Complete an online project review form about the project within four weeks of completing your grant, and no later than 14 months after receipt of grant.
- Maintain financial records for all grant spending
- Be available for a monitoring visit by The London Community Foundation or Grosvenor

## **Living Wage Friendly Funder**

The London Community Foundation is now a Living Wage Friendly Funder. This scheme, run by the Living Wage Foundation means that The London Community Foundation will actively encourage and support applications from organisations willing to pay staff the Living Wage (currently £13.85 per hour in London), or higher.
