LCC are a small local charity that was established in 1981 in response to the Brixton riots. The centre manages and delivers a range of free activities for families with children 0–16 years out of the Max Roach Centre and has a longstanding and trusted relationship with the local community.

Staff at the LCC understand the sources and symptoms of the disadvantage faced by their local community within the most deprived ward in Lambeth.

They get it.

At the start of the pandemic their small team immediately got into action executing swift and evolving programmes of emergency response projects to support some of the most vulnerable children and young people in their neighbourhood.

Looking back they can proudly say they worked with over 100 families, enlisted young people to become volunteer playworkers in their community, cooked and served an incredible 950 meals served by an army of volunteers (some of which were children!) and delivered 4000 Happy Lunches and play packs to local children and young people who needed it most.
