Name of funded organisation	Description of grant awarded
Camden Disability Action	£10,000 toward the cost of volunteer coordination, recruitment and training to increase participation of community volunteers supporting a range of services for disabled people in Camden.
Camden Giving	£10,000 to run a 2-week inclusive and accessible decision-making course to increase the participation of 10 Camden residents from a range of backgrounds in local grant-making decisions.
Camden People's Theatre	£9,960 contribution toward the Executive Director salary and to increase the sustainability of an Outreach Officer post, enabling harder-to-reach Camden residents' benefit from cultural activities to improve health and wellbeing.
Camden Psychotherapy Unit	£10,000 toward the overheads of a psychotherapy service to improve mental health and reduce isolation for vulnerable Camden residents.
Opening Doors London	£9,955 to increase the capacity of the Members Services Coordinator to reach isolated, lonely and vulnerable older LGBT+ residents in Camden.
Scene & Heard	£8,278 toward the running costs of an after-school drama and writing course; pairing children in Somers Town with volunteer theatre professionals.
The Kosmos Centre	£10,000 to contribution to staff costs and overheads to run weekly social wellbeing activities for older BME women, particularly those with mild dementia and mental health issues, in Kentish Town.
Urban Community Projects	£9,600 to run a youth-led app creation and music production programme as a diversionary activity and to raise awareness of knife and gang crime in Camden Maiden Lane and York Rise housing estates.
Third Age Project	£10,000 towards a manager's salary and to provide training for staff and volunteers who reduce inequalities amongst older people in Camden through a befriending scheme, centre-based social and wellbeing activities, and outreach.
Speak Street	£6,000 towards management costs and overheads of free, flexible community-based language sessions for isolated migrants in Camden to improve their everyday language skills with native speakers.
Action Youth Boxing Intervention	£10,000 toward the core costs of running weekly youth boxing and cognitive behaviour interventions with young people aged 13-18 involved in or at risk of serious youth violence and gang culture in Somers Town.
C4WS Homeless Project	£10,000 toward the salaries of a Project Manager and Welfare Manager of a winter night shelter, providing a tailored support package of housing, employment, benefits, immigration, addiction and health advice to help guests out of homelessness.
Calthorpe Project	£10,000 and the salaries of a Project Worker and Director of a community garden, increasing capacity to engage harder-to-reach local families and older people to reduce isolation; and to help the organisation achieve the Trusted Charity Quality Mark.
