FAQ: Pathways to Economic Opportunities Programme (P2E)

| If successful, when will the grant be available? Can I apply for funding to extend a current project/activities? | Successful applicants will have two years from Wednesday 1st June 2022 to complete spending and provide a final monitoring report about the project/activity within four weeks of completing the project and no later than 25 months after the fund start date. The grant will be made available once the grant agreement has been signed and returned. Yes, however, we will not be able to fund project/service costs which are already funded (also known as double-funding). |

| What are the priority boroughs? | Barking & Dagenham, Brent, Croydon, Hounslow, Newham, Tower Hamlets and Waltham Forest. |
| Do you need to be based in a priority borough to be eligible for funding? | Whilst activites will be prioritised in the selected boroughs, consideration may be given to work with organisations who are not based in a priority borough by looking at need and opportunity. | What kind of things will the funding cover? | We are committed to covering project costs, full core costs or a mix of both (full cost recovery). More information can be found on the application form) and fund guidelines (page 7) available on the fund webpage here . |
| We are a newer organisation and don't have a three-year track record, can we still apply? | Whilst we recognise the value of newer organisations who are responsive to wider needs, this programme has been specifically designed to build the resilience of those organisations who have been operating for at least three years and have established services. LCF has a range of other funds that may benefit your organisation. Please sign up to our newsletter to receive updates on our open grants. |
| Is it possible to receive a full list of organisations that were awarded a grant in Phase 1? | In Phase 1 (the last round by invitation only) we funded six organisations. | Who can attend organisational development sessions? | Organisational development sessions will be open to organisations who are successful in being awarded Phase 2 funding from the programme. |
