Organisation	Description
Account3	Provide one-to-one support in Tower Hamlets to BAMER women aged 18-64 and their families who are facing multiple disadvantages impacting life chances. Deliver IAG support, training for qualifications and improved local connections, including childcare support to enhance their confidence, or career and life chances in employment/self-employment (enterprise) and financial health. BAMER families get one-to-one advice which improves their living circumstance and puts more money in their pockets, or which maintains their homes in the face of evictions or debt. www.account3.org.uk
Bangladesh Youth Movement	Provide support In Tower Hamlets to unemployed BAME & Bangladeshi communities aged 18-64 through "Opening Doors" to reduce isolation and build confidence to progress along employment pathways and gain inclusive access to employment through personal development training, language skills and accreditation, employment and financial health pathway plans and advice, information and guidance, which include debt and benefits to support pathways from benefits to employment. www.bym.org.uk
Communities Welfare Network	Provide support to BME communities aged 25-64 in Lambeth and Southwark to address the chronic unemployment and poverty issues that migrants and refugees face. The targeted group have difficulties in gaining employment, live in poverty, on low income and are in debt and/or homeless. Deliver employment and self-employment skills (enterprise) and related advice sessions to increase participants' employability chances and job retention, including after-care support. www.communitywelfare.net.org
Golden Opportunity Skills and Development	Provide support to the BAMER community in Ealing, Hillingdon and Hounslow aged 18-64 to develop employability/self-employment (enterprise) and financial health skills including improving language skills and confidence to progress into employment/self-employment opportunities. Support includes Specialised Multilingual IAG, tailored skills development and a blend of accredited and non-accredited training and after care to deal with the different barriers faced that are hindering progression into the world of work/self-employment, such as debt and homelessness. www.gosad.org.uk
Skills and Training Network	Provide support to the BAMER community in Enfield, Haringey and Islington who are unemployed on low income, low-skilled or in low-paid/insecure jobs aged 18-64 experiencing multiple disadvantages (predominately BAMER women). Deliver upskilling support in employability, self-employment (enterprise) work experience, vocational care and further education training and social welfare-related problems, which include developing a Personal Career Plan, which enables from the outset confidence building, ownership of learning and mapping actions and milestones into employment. www.sntnetwork.org.uk
Youth League UK	Provide support to young adults aged 18-25 in Barking, Dagenham and Havering from diverse backgrounds and ethnic groups who are on low income, socially isolated and unemployed. Deliver personal support by matched mentoring on employability, training and providing work placement opportunities. The support includes the tools and resources needed to improve confidence, gain work and leadership skills and volunteer experience, and eventually effect change in their communities. www.youthleagueuk.org
